Out of the Past

The Pentoga Park property on the south shore of Chicagon Lake was once sold for \$200. The property had been owned by Chief Edwards, an Ojibwa Indian and his wife Pentoga head of the tribe that once occupied the village on the property. Edwards purchased the land from the government in 1881 where his people had lived for many years. When the good chief and his squaw decided to sell their property an eager buyer in John Glidden of Cleveland, a logger and explorer, bought the property in May of 1891. He held the property for many years until he sold it to D.M. Ross who in turn sold it to Iron County in 1922 for \$3,200.
